Rachel Gotlieb

Title: "Collecting Modern and Contemporary Ceramics at the Crocker Art Museum"

Rachel is the first Ruth Rippon Curator of Ceramics at the Crocker Art Museum. She will talk in the auditorium for 30 minutes and then take the attendees to the newly installed galleries for a 30 minute visit and discussion.

The Crocker's international ceramics collection is one of the largest in the United States and includes works dating from prehistoric to contemporary periods. Gotlieb, a leading ceramics specialist, is overseeing acquisitions, exhibitions, and scholarship, and helping to bring the collection to even greater prominence nationally and internationally.

D. Neath, aka The Art Lady, is a long standing fixture in the art community, an initiator of Second Saturday, the visual arts curator on the KVIE Art Auction, and currently runs the Archival Gallery.

Mima Begovic ran ArtSpace 1616 for a successful 5 year run and is currently contemplating another gallery space. She was a finalist for the Arts and Business Council's 2018 Emerging Arts Leader.

Beth Jones and Linda Jolley ran JAYJAY Gallery for over 20 years before closing the exhibit space during the COVID shutdown. They maintain their successful art consulting business, Beth Jones Art Consultant, and remain very active in selling and placing art works.

Title: "An Artist's Alchemy: Curiosity, Creativity, Community and Clay"

Anthony Maki Gill is an art maker, arts advocate, educator, and community-builder living and working in the foothills of Northern California.

He began his career as an arts educator, facilitating art experiences for foster, houseless and incarcerated youth.

Some of Anthony's community collaborations include: co-founding a 10,000 square foot art center for the community, establishing a city-wide art walk, leading the Standing Guard tea-bowl project, and participating in the creation of "The Art of Real Food" cookbook.

Anthony also facilitates weekly donation-based art workshops at his Auburn studio for a diverse community of makers.
